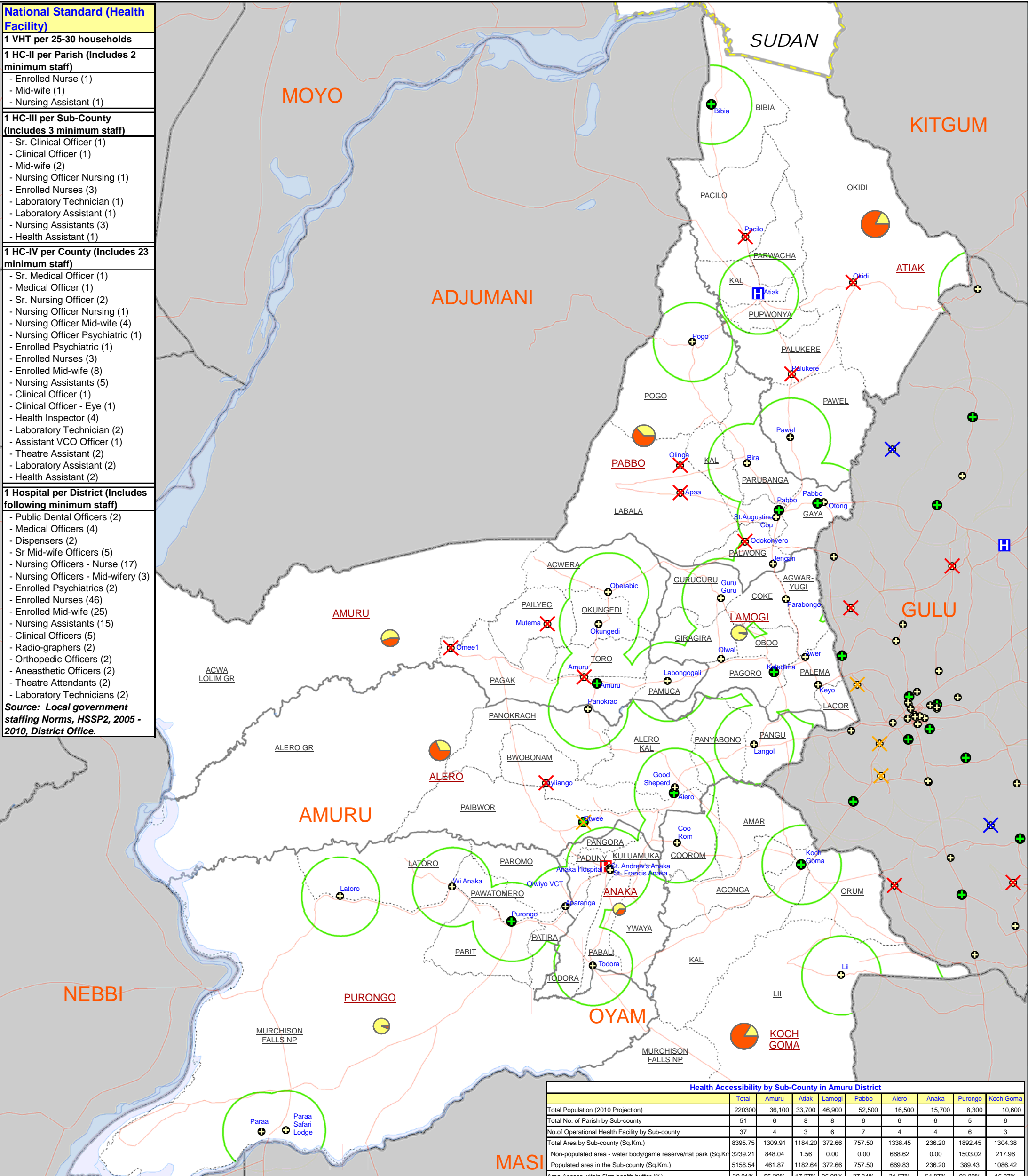

- Approximate area falls inside 5 km zones are treated as accessible & falls outside are treated as not accessible.
- Accessibility is based on aerial distance. Assumed that people travel most direct route in plain area.
- Pie size is graduated by total area of sub-County.
