

OVERALL OBJECTIVES AND GBV STRATEGY

Capacity building¹ of duty-bearers and service providers to improve GBV prevention and response² at District and sub-county:

- Safety and Security Actors (Police/ UPDF)
- Justice/ judiciary actors
- Health sector (district, facility and community level)
- Social service providers (social workers³, case managers, specialized community groups)
- Local government (civil service and political)
- Other community groups (religious leaders)
- Multi-sectoral service providers (watsan, education, livelihood, etc)

Conduct targeted advocacy interventions at district and sub-county levels, linked to national advocacy efforts, to increase the presence of GBV service providers; address key obstacles to accessing health services and legal redress in accordance with guiding principles.

To provide services to survivors who seek and wish to receive; to prevent further harm at district and sub-county levels

- Medical
- Legal
- Psychosocial
- Safety/security

Develop or strengthen government and non-government GBV coordination mechanisms and service delivery at district and sub-county level:

- National sub cluster coordinating body
- District Sub-cluster working groups
- Sub-county coordination mechanism to be developed
- Multi level coordination

Strengthen and standardize a safe system to collect, store, analyze and share gender-based violence related data/ information to inform programme planning, monitoring, and advocacy
