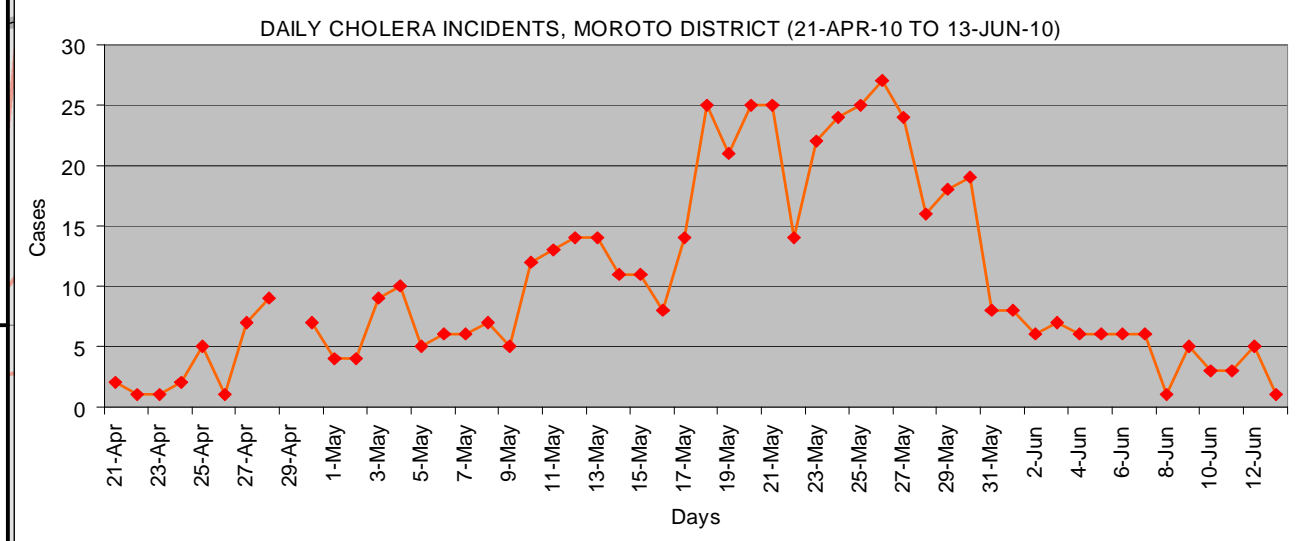
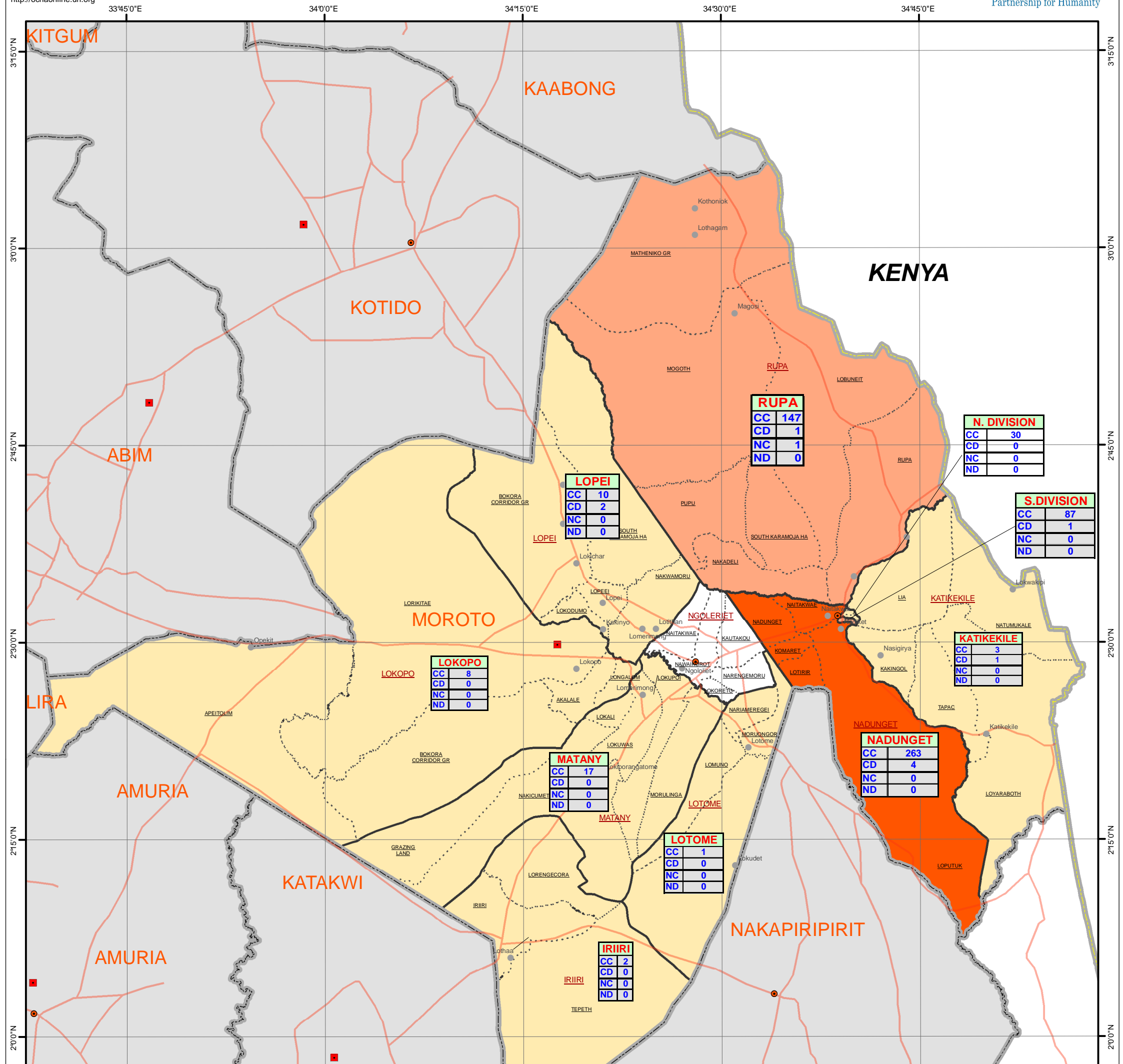
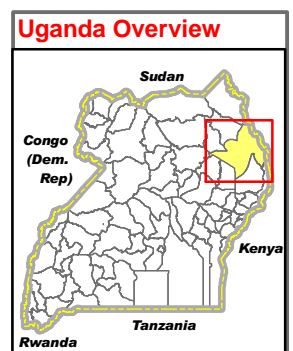


Moroto District: Cholera Affected Areas & Cases (as of 13 June 2010)
