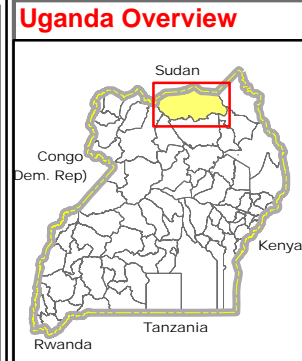
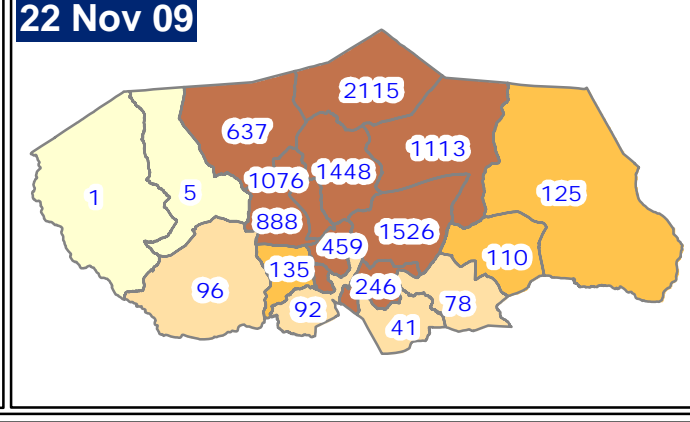
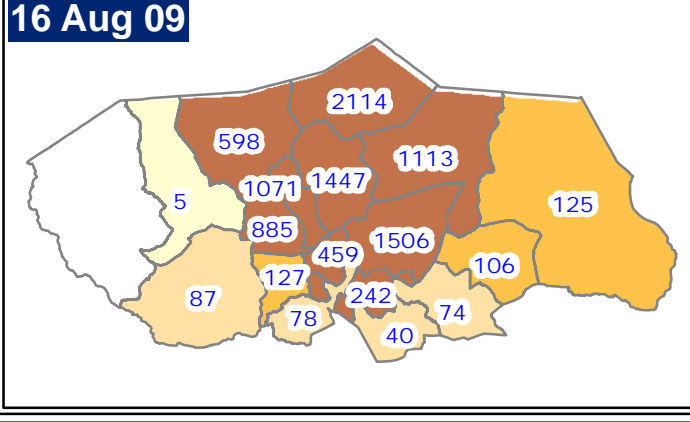
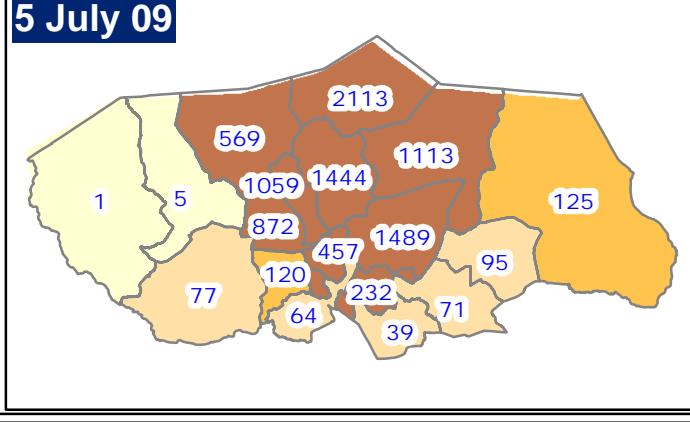
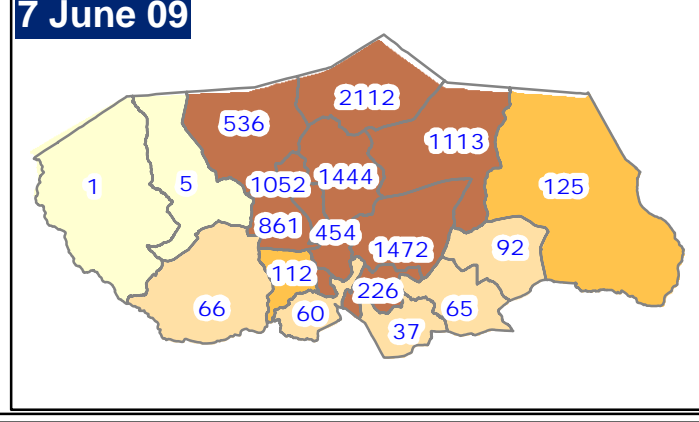
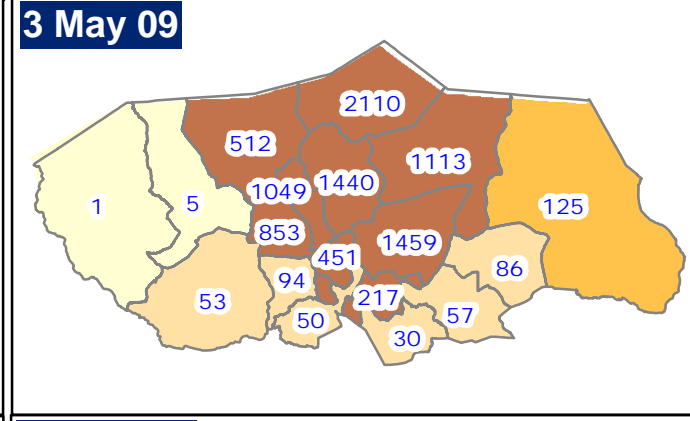
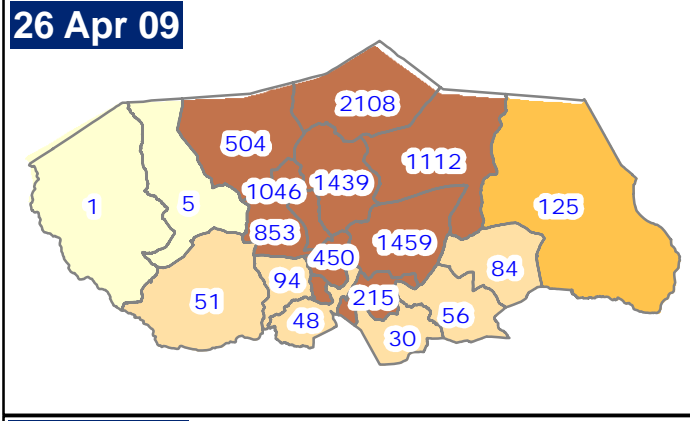
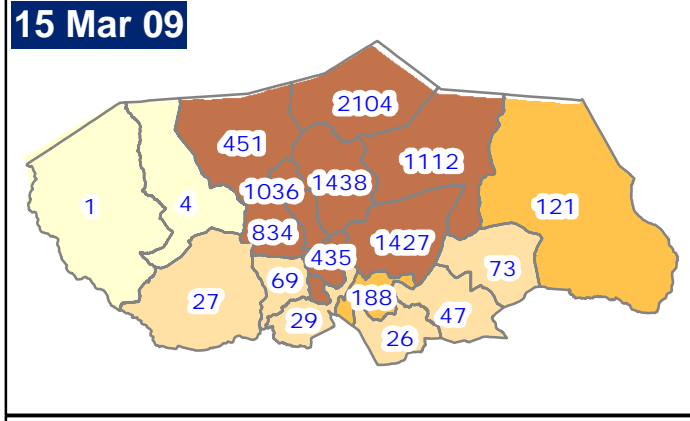
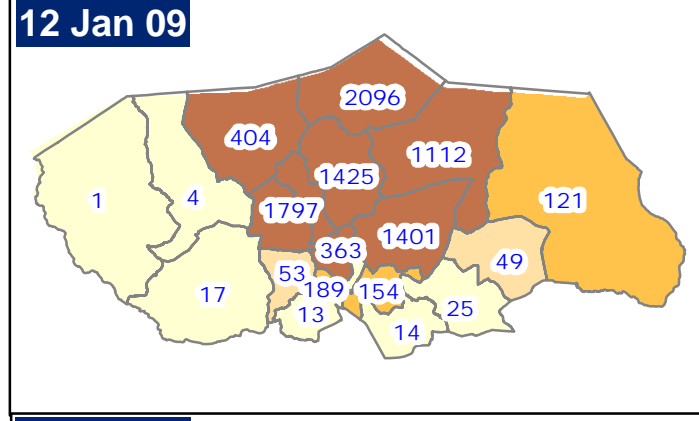
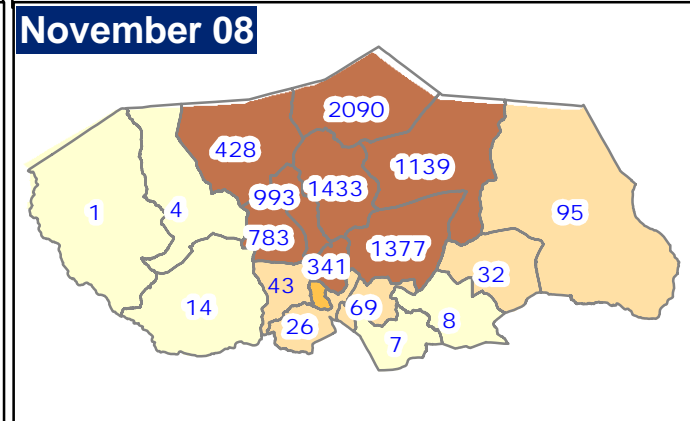
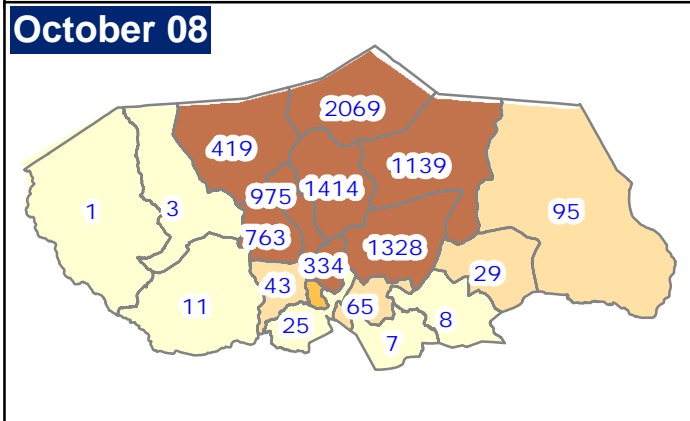
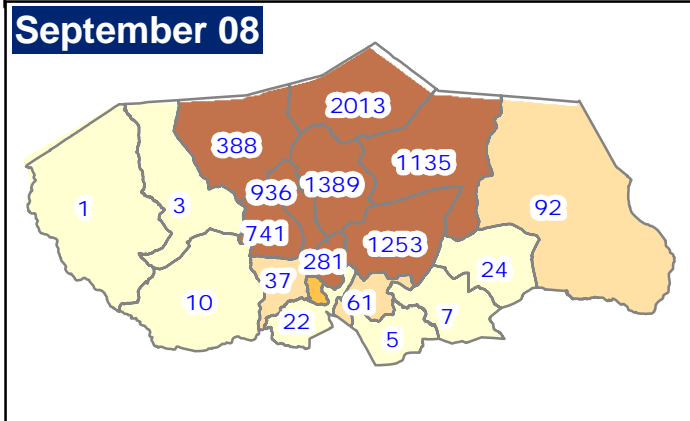
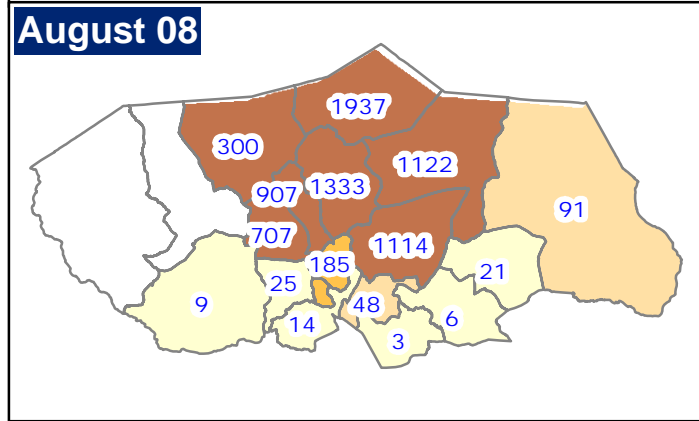
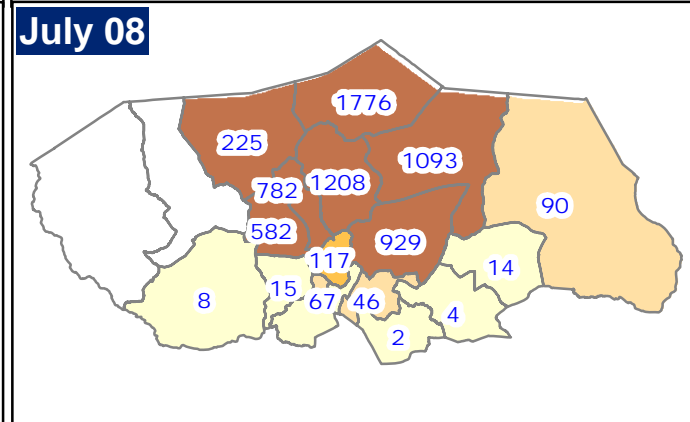
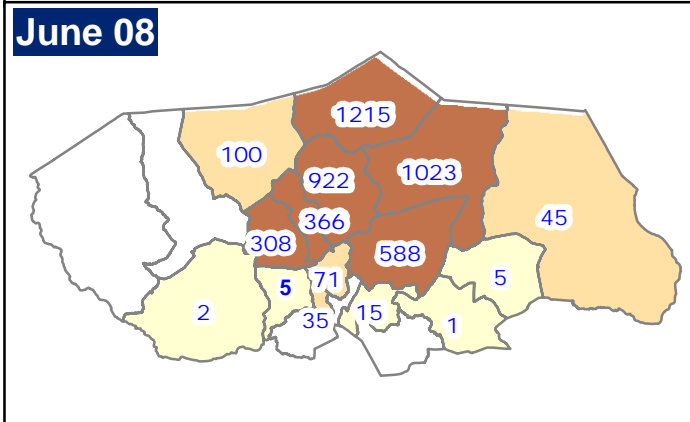
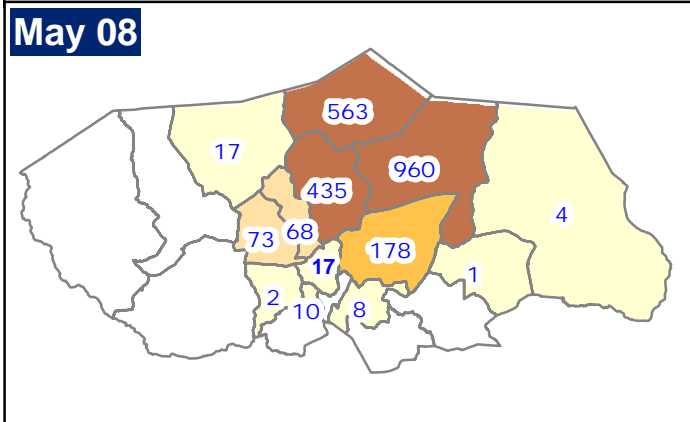
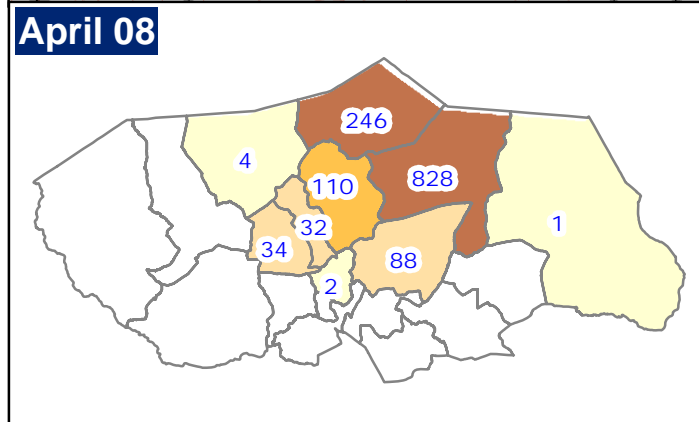
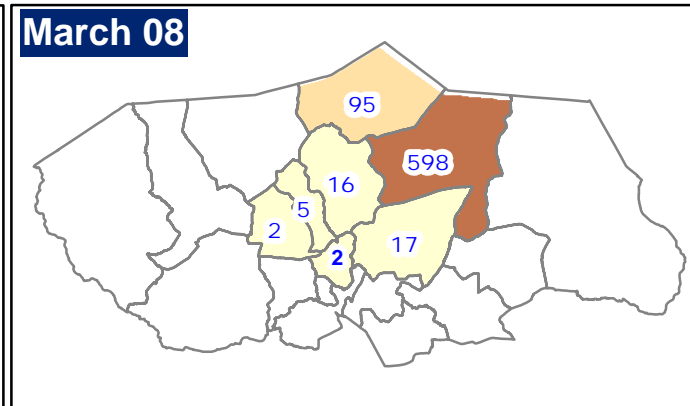
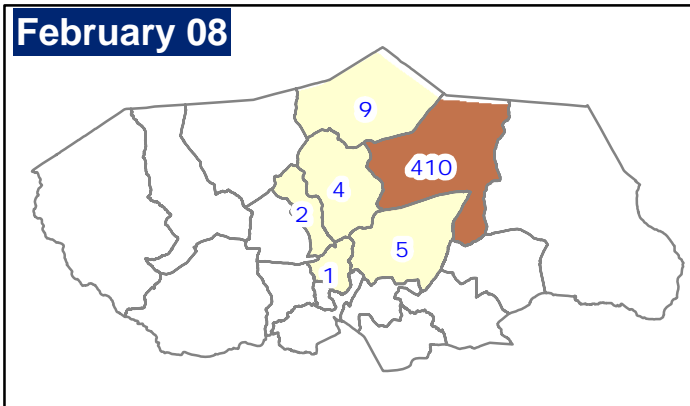
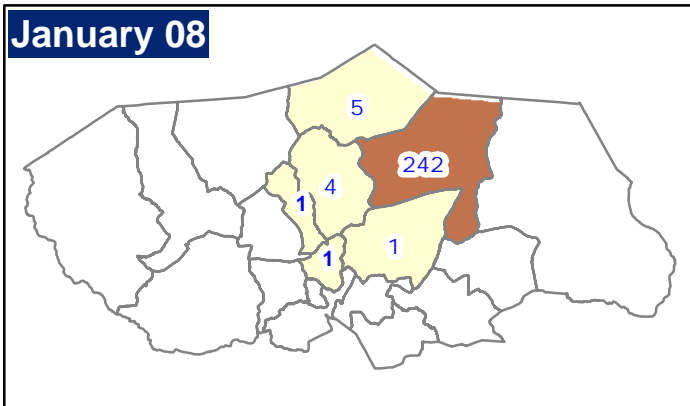
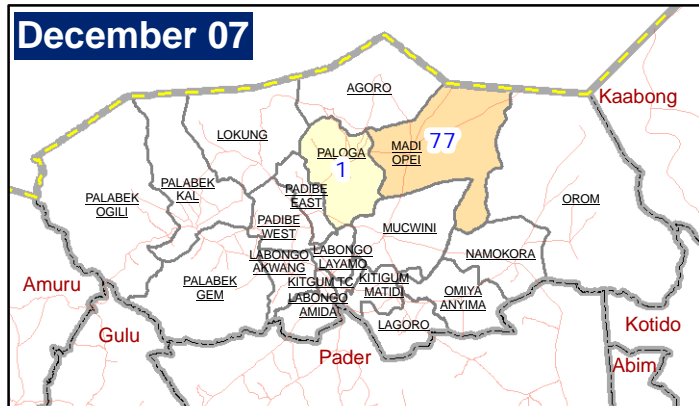


Kitgum District: Hepatitis E Case Trends by Sub-County (Cumulative: December 07 - 22 Nov 2009)
